Writing the Missing: The adDress is a durational performance. Often durational pieces involve pushing ourselves to the limit but this piece is about finding and honouring our limits

The installation

All the materials used are recycled, reclaimed, repurposed or ethically sourced.

Calico is the fabric often used in dressmaking to make the toile that is the sample pattern and design for the finished piece. It is never the beautiful thing. It becomes a scrap. As a disabled person I have often felt like a scrap, especially during the political rhetoric of the last few years. Here, calico is reclaimed as the final piece, the beautiful object, transformed into

a vision of rest and power.
